



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. What is the Canadian Touring Car Championship Presented By Continental Tire (CTCC)?

CTCC is Canada's only professional touring car championship. It features Canada's Best Drivers Racing Today's Hottest Touring Cars. The race cars are production-based and compete in three unique Classes. B-Spec Class is the entry level category and features sub-compact models with strictly controlled modifications (only specified suspension kits are permitted). Touring Class is the next level with minimally modified race cars while Super Class is for heavily modified race cars. Some popular brands include Acura, Audi, BMW, Chevrolet, Honda, Hyundai, Mazda, Mini, Mitsubishi, Scion, Subaru, Toyota and VW. The Championship competes at some of the most challenging tracks in Canada.

2. Where are the races?

CTCC races at some of the best tracks in Canada. The season typically opens in May and ends in September. The races are from 30 to 45 minutes in length. The full schedule is available on the website. www.touringcar.ca

3. How can I race in CTCC?

All drivers must be licensed by ASN Canada FIA to be eligible to compete in CTCC. US citizens must hold a National or Pro licence issued by an FIA-affiliated racing organization **and** an ASN Canada FIA membership. For drivers new to racing, you should consider taking an approved racing school and demonstrate your capabilities at the amateur level before competing in CTCC. 4. Is my race car eligible for competition?

All race cars must conform to the CTCC Regulations. The Regulations are available on the website under Competitor Info. In general, the maximum allowed engine size is 3.0 litres and race cars cannot be any older than ten years past the model cut-off date. Eligible vehicle models are listed in the Regulations. Refer to Section 4.0 and 6.0 of the Regulations for more detail. Application may be made to CTCC for models not currently listed in the Regulations.



5. How do I register for CTCC?

CTCC Registration Forms are available on the website under Competitor Info. Please complete all of the Forms and return them to the CTCC office along with your Registration Fee by March 31, 2012.

6. How do I get the CTCC decals and patches?

CTCC decals and patches will be sent out beginning in April to all registered competitors. The decal layout for race cars is available in the Regulations. The patch layout for drivers' suits and crew uniforms is available in the Regulations too.

7. What kind of tires is used in CTCC?

The specified tire for CTCC is the Continental Tire ExtremeContact race tire. The standard tire size for Super Class is 245/40R17 and the standard tire size for Touring Class is 225/45R17. The standard tire size for B-Spec Class is 205/50R15. There are different tires for dry and wet conditions. Competitors must purchase tires through the CTCC designated dealer. The dealer will be attending each event to provide on-site tire service and support. The details of the tire program are available on the website under Competitor Info.

8. How do I enter a CTCC event?

CTCC Entry Forms are available on the website under Competitor Info. The form and payment must be returned to the CTCC office one week (7 days) prior to the first day of the event being entered.

9. What are the CTCC fees?

CTCC fees are shown on the Entry Form and available on the website under Competitor Info.
